- F 7596 Sarah⁴, b. 14 Mar 1705/06, Malden, Middlesex Co., MA. She was baptized at with her four sisters Abigail, Elizabeth, Hannah, and Mary at Rumney Marsh (Chelsea), MA, on 27 July 1717. Married Joseph Hallowell (or Holloway), 6 Apr 1725, Boston, MA. (Prentiss Glazier gives his name as Thomas Hallowell.) Joseph Hallowell may have been the son of Benjamin & Mary (Stocker) Hallowell, of Boston, MA, b. 22 Nov 1702; d. 29 June 1752. Sarah died 18 Aug 1798.
- F 7597 Abigail⁴, b. 24 Feb 1707/08, Malden, Middlesex Co., MA. Married Thomas Eustis, 12 May 1730, Boston, MA. Died 18 Aug 1798, North Chelsea, MA. +
- F 7598 Elizabeth⁴, b. 26 Sep 1710, Boston, Suffolk Co., MA. She was baptized at Rumney Marsh (Chelsea), 21 July 1717, along with her sisters Sarah, Abigail, Hannah, and Mary. Died 12 Dec 1721, Chelsea, MA, "aged 11 years, 3 months, and 16 days." Buried at Revere, MA.
- F 7599 Hannah⁴, b. 10 Nov 1712, Boston, Suffolk Co., MA. Married David Burnap, 1 Jan 1740/41, Chelsea, MA. Died 20 Feb 1787, Southborough, MA. +
- F 7600 Mary⁴, b. 5 Mar 1714/15, Boston, Suffolk Co., MA. She was baptized at Rumney Marsh (Chelsea), 21 July 1717, along with her sisters Sarah, Abigail, Elizabeth, and Hannah. Married John Hasey, 2 Jan 1734/35, Boston, MA. Died before 9 Oct 1755, when her children were named as heirs of her father John.

- M 7601 John⁴, b. 9 Mar 1716/17, Boston, Suffolk Co., MA. Died 29 Apr 1717, Chelsea, MA, “aged 7 weeks” (Gravestone record).
- F 7602 Rachel⁴, b. 15 Mar 1718, Chelsea, Suffolk Co., MA. Died 30 Mar 1718, Chelsea, MA, “aged 15 days” (Gravestone record).
- F 7603 Susanna⁴, bp. 15 Nov 1719, Chelsea, Suffolk Co., MA. Married John Sargent, 11 Jan 1742/43, Chelsea, MA. +
- F 7604 Lydia⁴, b. 14 Nov 1721, Chelsea, Suffolk Co., MA. Baptized there 19 Nov 1721. Died 18 Aug 1722, Chelsea, MA, “aged 9 months and 4 days” (Gravestone record).
- F 7605 Lois⁴, bp. 13 Oct 1723, Chelsea, Suffolk Co., MA. Died 4 Oct 1725, Chelsea, MA, “aged 1 year, 11 months, and 21 days” (Gravestone record).

BIOGRAPHICAL

Hannah’s parents were of Boston, MA. Her surname is variously spelled as Hasey and Hasie. On 18 Dec 1708, Hannah joined with John in a quitclaim deed of their right in certain lands, “which our mother Hannah Bancroft gave us.”

In 1715, he was a tenant of the large Newgate farm of over 400 acres in the Rumney Marsh district of Boston which later became Revere. On 26 Oct 1726, for the sum of £1625, he bought of John Tenny, a tract of land at Pullen Point in Boston comprising some 103 acres with 20 acres adjoining and one-third of Snake Island in the cove on which the land fronted. This area later became what is now Winthrop (*Suffolk Deeds*, Liber XII, P. 100). There was a mortgage on the land which the purchased assumed.

In June 1720, he was named Deacon of the church at Rumney Marsh. On 1 Mar 1733/34, “Deacon John Chamberlain” asked to be relieved of the care of the church funds at Rumney Marsh, “because of his removal to live at Pullen-point.” He had been a deacon of the church since June 1720. On 26 Mar 1729, the selectmen of Boston chose him one of a committee to run the lines and renew the bound marks between the town of Boston and the towns of Lynn, Reading and Malden.

On 14 Jan 1741, John Chamberlain, of Chelsea, yeoman, and Mary his wife conveyed their rights in lands, late the estate of Richard Hilton, of Charlestown, MA (*Middlesex Deeds*, Liber 41, P. 708). Mary was the daughter of Mrs. Mary Atwood, late of Boston, widow, who inherited lands under the terms of the will of Richard Hilton, dated 16 Jan 1720/21, in which she was called “cousin.”

A query in the Boston Evening Transcript of 2 June 1909, says John married Hannah³ Hasey (Joseph², William¹) and wants to know who the parents of William¹ Hasey were.

Their first five children were baptized on 21 July 1717 at Rumney Marsh. His second wife Mary survived him.

In 1755, his heirs were his widow Mary, Sarah Hallowell, Abigail Eustice, Hannah & David Burnap, Susanna & John Sergeant, and the heirs of Mary Hasie.
