F 8072 Emily<sup>6</sup>, b. 11 Feb 1811, Woodstock, Windham Co., CT. Married George Seaver, 6 Dec 1831.

M 8073 Nathan<sup>6</sup>, b. 5 June 1815, Woodstock, Windham Co., CT.

M 8074 Amos<sup>6</sup>, b. 9 Oct 1817, Woodstock, Windham Co., CT.

F 8075 Mary<sup>6</sup>, b. 30 Oct 1821, Woodstock, Windham Co., CT. Married Mr. Coman, who died before 1846. According to the *History of Oxford, MA*, Mary married (2) as a second wife, Ebenezer D. Rich, 13 Aug 1849. He was born 14 Dec 1814. They resided at New Boston and Rockville, CT, and Oxford, MA, where he rebuilt a mill and was a farmer and miller; also Selectman. He died at Oxford, MA, 6 Oct 1871.

F 8076 Olive<sup>6</sup>, b. 2 Oct 1825, Woodstock, Windham Co., CT. Married Marcus L. Randall.

F 8077 Sylvia<sup>6</sup>, b. 11 Oct 1828, Woodstock, Windham Co., CT.

M 8078 John<sup>6</sup>, b. 2 Apr 1831, Woodstock, Windham Co., CT. Married Charlotte Burke, 1 Oct 1853, probably Oxford, MA. She was the daughter of Thomas Burke, born about 1830, Easton, MA. He was a weaver who lived in Oxford, MA, in 1853, and died 28 Apr 1873, Northbridge, MA.

## BIOGRAPHICAL

Some records erroneously call him Nathaniel. Polly was admitted to the church and her children Emily and Nathan were baptized. Her surname is various spelled as Goodlae or Goodell.

Nathan bought land with buildings “thereon” in the northeast part of Thompson, CT, “on the East side of the road leading from Woodstock to Dudley through Thompson.” In 1814, he bought more land adjacent. On 3 May 1822, he was chosen a member of a committee of the church to start a Sunday school. He served in the War of 1812.

He died before 25 Nov 1840 (on which date his Inventory was probably taken). On 11 June 1846, his heirs, widow Polly, George and Emily Seaver, Marcus L. and Olive Randall, and Mary Coman, all of Thompson, CT, and Nathan Chamberlain, of Athol, MA, for himself and as guardian of his brother John Chamberlain, sold land in Thompson (*Thompson, CT, Deeds*).

Prentiss Glazier says to check the *Dwight Genealogy*.

In 1810, he was the “Nathan A. Chamberlain,” living at Woodstock, CT, heading a family of 0011-001. In this census, he probably had a younger brother living with them. In 1820, he was of Thompson, CT, aged 26-44 years, heading a family of 20001-1001. In 1830, again of Thompson, aged 40-50 years, his family consisted of 0011001-2101001.
