BIOGRAPHICAL

No record of any family. Her first husband, Freeland Converse, was the son of Willard & Betsey (— ?—) Tucker, and died 16 Aug 1845, “of brain fever, aged 38 years.”

The *Sprague Journal of the Maine Historical Society* in Vol. III, April 1915 to Apr 1916, says in part:

“that he was a man of broad culture and liberal education and a forceful, able writer. He wrote much for the press and for agricultural publications. He was a pioneer advocate for forest preservation and conservation, talking, writing, and lecturing along these lines when the science was in its infancy. For many years of his long life, he was prominent in the educational life of the community and an active worker in all things, tending to promote the interests and development of Piscataquis County. At one time, he was a member of the State Board of Agriculture and only lacked a single year of serving a half century as a trustee of Foxcraft Academy.”

He was first elected a Trustee of the Foxcraft Academy on 17 Oct 1838, and was later President of the board.
