BIOGRAPHICAL

According to Glazier, Alpheus married Rachel —?—, that she died in 1866, Uxbridge, MA; all this according to a family bible in the Connecticut State Library. Glazier also says that Alpheus died 14 Sep 1839, aged 66 years, according to a church record, but does not identify the church, but it is presumed be in Mansfield, CT.

In 1800, Alpheus Chamberlain was living in Willington, Windham Co., CT, heading a family of 1001-1001 (1 male under the age of 10 years, 1 male between the ages of 26 and 45 years, 1 female under the age of 10 years, 1 female between the ages of 26 and 45 years).

In 1810, Alpheus Chamberlain was again living in Mansfield, Windham Co., CT, heading a family of 1001-1001 (1 male under the age of 10 years, 1 male between the ages of 26 and 45 years, 1 female under the age of 10 years, 1 female between the ages of 26 and 45 years).

In 1820, Alpheus Chamberlain was again still living in Mansfield, Windham Co., CT, heading a family of 000001-0001 (1 male aged 45 years and upwards, 1 female between the ages of 26 and 45 years). One person engaged in Manufactures.

The foregoing census records indicate that Alpheus and Rachel probably only had two children, a son and daughter, or at least, they were only ones that probably survived to adulthood.

Alpheus is not identified in the 1830 census, when he may have been living with relatives.

[Note that Mansfield was originally in Windham County. When Tolland County was organized in 1785, mostly from Windham, the town of Mansfield now straddled the county line separating Tolland and Windham counties. This situation lasted until 1827, when Tolland gained additional territory from Windham, and at that time Mansfield was entirely within Tolland County. The 1790-1820 censuses all show Mansfield as part of Windham until 1830, when it became part of Tolland County.]
